- ◆ Pitch a tent in your living room! (if you don't have a tent, put some chairs together and make a blanket fort!)
- ◆ Read stories together inside the tent or fort.
- ◆ Make S'mores! You will need marshmallows, graham crackers, and chocolate bars.
  - Microwave the marshmallow for a few seconds, and pop it onto the graham cracker.
  - Top with chocolate and another graham cracker, and you have an instant, yummy S'more!
- ◆ Have your child draw a S'more or make one out of construction paper!
