MATH FOR ALL STARRY NIGHT COUNTING CONTEST

When the weather is nice and the sky is clear and cloudless, the night sky fills with stars.

Though it is not possible to count all the stars in the sky. It is fun to try. HOW TO PLAY:

Decide on a time interval (for example, one minute) and set a timer. Pick a person to count first. How many stars can they count before the timer rings? Take turns counting. The person who counts the most stars wins!

MORE CHALLENGING:

Constellations are dot-to-dot pictures that tell ancient stories made with your imagination and the stars. Set the timer. The person who can name and point out the most constellations before the timer rings wins!

MOST CHALLENGING:

Some stars have names! Some things commonly mistaken for stars are actually planets and other planets' moons! The person who names the most stellar objects correctly before the timer rings is the winner!
